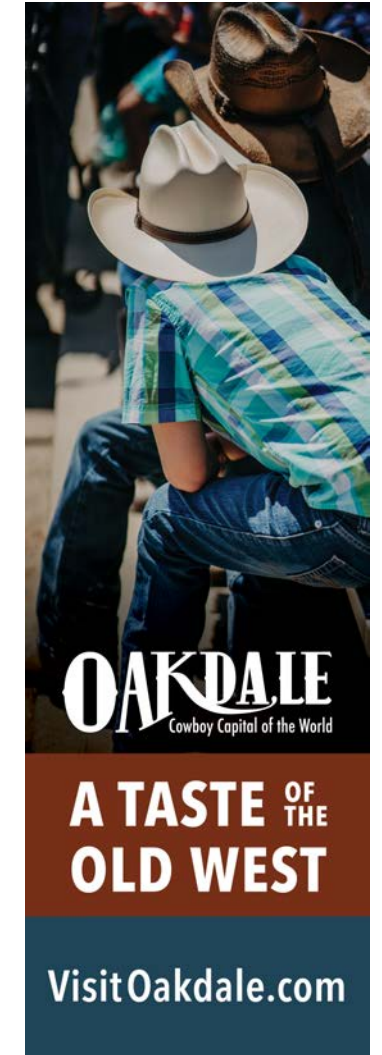
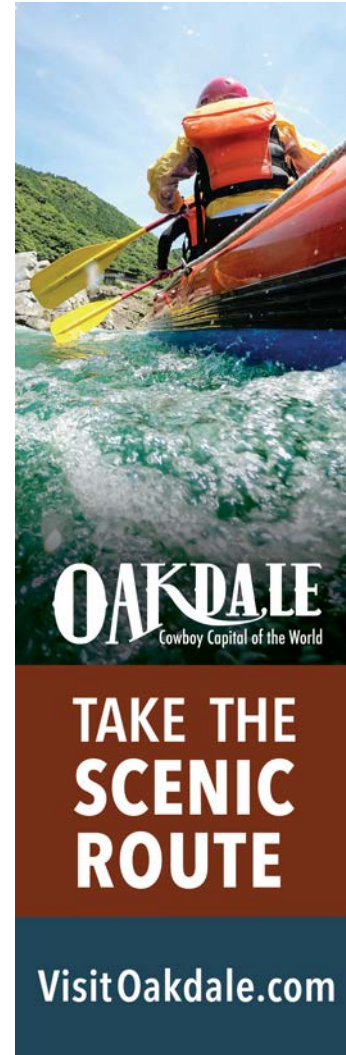

- 11.7: Discuss Current Fire Services Agreement with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District and Options Available to the City of Oakdale.

City Manager Whitemyer discussed the current fire service agreement with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District and the options available to the City of Oakdale. At the January 22, 2019 City Council meeting, City Council directed city staff to send a letter to Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District with recommendations of what the City would like to see with the current agreement and what they would be willing to accommodate.

City Manager Whitemyer received a response from the Stanislaus Consolidated's Fire Board and presented that response to City Council.

In regards to the City of Oakdale's request that Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District hire an outside firm to conduct a fiscal health assessment with input from the City of Oakdale and the Oakdale Fire Protection District, City Manager Whitemyer stated that they have hired an outside consultant and advised the data and figures from that study will be presented at Stanislaus Consolidated's March 14, 2019 meeting. With that, City Manager Whitemyer recommended to City Council that no formal action be taken on extending the fire services agreement until after the March 14, 2019 SCFPD financial presentation.



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Council Member Bairos said she would like to hear from the Oakdale Rural Fire Protection District Board on their thoughts on this issue.

Vincent Victorine, an Oakdale Rural Fire Protection District Board Member, was in attendance at the City Council meeting and stated that his board has concerns regarding the items Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District responded no to, especially in regards to the JPA and being able to have a seat at the table during negotiations. He said he is agreement with City Manager Whitemyer regarding budgetary issues and agrees with waiting until the March 14, 2019 financial presentation before making a decision.

Council Member Smith asked for clarity regarding the liability shortfall that Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District stated they expected Oakdale city and Oakdale Rural Fire Protection District to cover.

Council Member Chiara asked if the current Stanislaus Consolidated Fire /Firefighters Association Local 3399 MOU expires in December 2019, when will they begin negotiations to which City Manager Whitemyer replied he believes they are in negotiations right now.

Derek Nichols, Local 3399 President, advised that the Firefighters Association (Local 3399) are currently in talks with the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District Board and that Local 3399 understands the liability issues and that they and the District Board are working hard at it.

City Manager Whitemyer concluded his report to City Council with the recommendation that no formal action be taken on extending the fire services agreement until after the March 14, 2019 SCFPD financial presentation.

All Members of the City Council concurred on taking no action until after Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District's financial presentation at their March 14, 2019 meeting.

I. Background / Discussion

The City of Oakdale entered into a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Oakdale Miscellaneous Bargaining Unit (OMEBU) for fiscal years 2018-2019 through 2021-2022.

This MOU was approved by City Council on July 16, 2018 through Resolution 2018-116.

As part of the process, it was intended for Section 2.18 (Performance Incentive Pay Plan) to reflect seven (7) years of City service, not seven and one-half (7 ½) years of City service, in which an employee of this bargaining unit would be eligible for Performance Incentive Pay. This is what was agreed upon and briefed to the City Council. This is also reflective of the language contained in the Police Officers Association (POA) MOU.

Through a scrivener error, the seven and one-half (7 ½ years) was left in the MOU. The attached Side Letter will make the correction to the intended wording and the approval of the Resolution will put a formality and historical correction to this change.

This letter is to clarify that there was a Scrivener error in the OMEBU MOU for 7-1-2018 to 6/30/2022. The change below reflects the correct language. All other terms and conditions of the existing MOU shall remain in full force and effect. The changes are listed below.

1. Article II, Section 2.18 shall be modified to read as follows:

Section 2.18 Performance Incentive Pay Plan

Employees in this bargaining unit shall be eligible for pay increases in addition to the normal step ranges and/or negotiated increases. Such increases shall not exceed five percent (5%) and shall be made in increments of two and one-half percent (2.5%) with eligibility limited to those employees who have completed ~~seven and one-half (7 ½)~~ seven (7) years of City service or more and subject to evaluation of the employee's performance by the employee's Department Head subject to the following:

- A. The employee's Performance Incentive Pay evaluation will take place during the employee's regularly scheduled Annual Evaluation. If for some reason the employee's Annual Evaluation is not completed by their anniversary date the employee shall be paid retroactive to their Annual Evaluation due date. The Department Head shall discuss the evaluation report with the employee and obtain the employee's acknowledgement of such discussion. The report shall include a recommendation concerning the employee's merit or performance pay increase. The employee must receive "Meets expectations" overall rating on the evaluation. Should the Department Head deny a performance pay increase to an eligible employee, the employee shall have a right of appeal to the City Manager as follows:

Appeal Within five (5) days after receiving the report of performance, an employee may request, in writing, a review of the report with the City Manager. Within five (5) days after said review, the City Manager shall either accept the original report, a modified report, or cause a new report to be prepared which shall be entered into the personnel file as the official report. I. BACKGROUND

Police staff is requesting authorization to purchase a 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe that will serve as a patrol vehicle assigned to Patrol Operations. The new Chevrolet Tahoe will replace an existing 2014 Chevrolet Tahoe that was involved in a traffic collision with a Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department vehicle. The traffic collision occurred on 8/16/2018 at approximately 2359 hours, as is reported under Oakdale Police Department Case Number OP18002425. The collision occurred when a Stanislaus County Sheriff's Deputy failed to stop at a solid red light and collided with Oakdale Police Department Unit #407.

The damage to the Oakdale Police Department vehicle exceeds the value of the vehicle. Following the traffic collision investigation by the California Highway Patrol and determination of fault (Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department), the San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority (RMA) has advised Staff to proceed with the purchase of a replacement vehicle, installation of all of the equipment, and submit paid invoices for reimbursement. When the purchase and build out of the replacement vehicle has been completed, the City of Oakdale Finance Director would submit all invoices to the RMA for reimbursement.

After consultation with the RMA, Staff is recommending the replacement purchase of a 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe from Steves Chevrolet outfitted with replacement emergency equipment with installation by Cook's Communication in the total amount of \$62,215.80 using funds from the Vehicle Replacement Fund 530-1910-441-009 to be reimbursed the total amount from the Central San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority with the reimbursement returned to the Vehicle Replacement Fund 530.

SUBJECT: Request for Authorization to Purchase and Outfit a Replacement Patrol Vehicle

II. DISCUSSION

Police staff is requesting authorization to purchase a 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe that will serve as a patrol vehicle assigned to Patrol Operations. The new Chevrolet Tahoe will replace an existing 2014 Chevrolet Tahoe (Unit #407) that was involved in a traffic collision with a Stanislaus County Sheriff's vehicle. The traffic collision occurred on 8/16/2018 at approximately 2359 hours, as is reported under Oakdale Police Department Case Number OP18002425. The collision occurred when a Stanislaus County Sheriff's Deputy failed to stop at a solid red light and collided with Oakdale Police Department Unit #407.

The collision was investigated by the California Highway Patrol. An Oakdale Police Officer in Oakdale Police Department Patrol Unit #407 was wearing his issued Body Worn Camera (BWC). And due to the officer's training and awareness, he activated the BWC at the time of the collision, and captured the signal light and collision on video. This BWC video was provided to California Highway Patrol to assist in their investigation. Their investigation determined the other party (Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department) was at fault for failing to stop at a solid red light.

The damage to the Oakdale Police Department vehicle exceeds the value of the vehicle. The San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority (RMA) has advised Staff to proceed with the purchase of a replacement vehicle, installation of all of the equipment, and submit paid invoices for reimbursement. When the purchase and build out of the replacement vehicle has been completed, the City of Oakdale Finance Director will submit all invoices to the RMA for reimbursement. Staff is recommending the purchase be made with existing funds from the Vehicle Replacement Fund 530-1910-441-009 with reimbursement to be made from the Central San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority back to the Vehicle Replacement Fund 530.

After consultation with the RMA on comparison replacement vehicles and pricing, Staff and the RMA are in agreement in recommending the replacement vehicle be a 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe purchased from Steves Chevrolet in the amount of \$38,649.51. This product is a direct replacement vehicle for Unit #407.

Staff is also requesting outfitting of the vehicle with replacement emergency equipment along with additional equipment and installation by Cook's Communications in the amount of \$23,566.29. Cook's Communications is our fleet's current emergency equipment outfitter.

Following final purchase of the vehicle from Vehicle Replacement Fund 530, the City of Oakdale Finance Director will submit the invoices to the RMA for reimbursement of the total cost of the purchase back to Vehicle Replacement Fund 530.

III. FISCAL IMPACTS

The cost of the replacement vehicle is \$38,649.51 and the purchase and installation of the emergency equipment is \$23,566.29. The purchase will be made with existing funds in the Vehicle Replacement Fund 530-1910-441-009 with reimbursement of the total cost of the purchase and build out to come from the Central San Joaquin Valley Risk Management Authority and return to the Vehicle Replacement Fund 530 following the purchase and build out.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

I. BACKGROUND

Staff is requesting authorization to purchase a 2017 Chevrolet Equinox LS. This vehicle will replace a 2007 Chevrolet Impala used as the City Hall pool car. This vehicle was involved in an accident and has been determined to be a total loss by the other party's insurance company. Proceeds from the insurance settlement will be used to offset the costs associated with the purchase of the replacement vehicle.

II. DISCUSSION

After an extensive search, staff was able to locate a used 2017 Chevrolet Equinox LS with 11,700 miles for sale at Steves Chevrolet in Oakdale, California, at a cost of \$17,700. The total cost with tax, license and fees is \$19,366.93.

Staff also found a 2018 Chevy Equinox LS with 20,783 miles at Roberts Auto Sales in Modesto, at a base cost of \$18,389 plus tax, license and fees.

As the vehicle from Steves Chevrolet has lower miles, lower cost, and is a local vendor, staff is recommending to City Council the purchase of the 2017 Chevrolet Equinox LS from Steves Chevrolet.

Staff is also requesting that the 2007 Impala be declared surplus so that it can be disposed of properly.

III. FISCAL IMPACTS

The cost of the vehicle is \$19,366.93 which is budgeted in the Fiscal Year 2018/19 Vehicle Replacement Fund 530. The insurance proceeds from the settlement will be deposited into Fund 530 to offset the purchase cost.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached Resolution authorizing staff to purchase a 2017 Chevrolet Equinox LS from Steves Chevrolet in the total amount of \$19,366.93 from Fund 530 and to surplus the 2007 Chevrolet Impala.

I. BACKGROUND

In 2001, the City performed an upgrade to the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) that included the installation of a new headworks. The headworks is one of the most critical areas of the WWTP. All of the wastewater flow from the City first arrives at the WWTP headworks, where the flow is metered, screened of foreign material, and equally split into the treatment basins.

II. DISCUSSION

Through two upgrades (2001 and 2011) the headworks has not been equipped with SCADA (Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition). SCADA allows for monitoring and control of the equipment that it is connected to. SCADA provides alarm calls when equipment fails or does not operate as intended. Being that the headworks is a critical piece of equipment, it is very important that staff know the status of the equipment at all times.

Due to the distance of the headworks from the main SCADA control center at the WWTP (approximately 700 feet), it is very costly to have traditional SCADA hooked up. However, due to new technology, the City has a great opportunity to install the XiO Cloud SCADA system. This system does not require thousands of feet of communication wire and hundreds of hours of engineering and programming in order for the equipment to communicate with each other.

An XiO system communicates using the Cloud, the internet, and a Verizon modem. The equipment comes ready to install by a licensed electrician (City Staff) and connects to 120VAC power. Staff will then have the ability to monitor equipment run times, produce reports on electrical consumption, and be notified of any alarms or equipment failures.

Both XiO and Tesco Controls, Inc. provided a quote for services for SCADA for the WWTP Headworks and are as follows:

WHEREAS, CSJVRMA Sidewalk Liability Mitigation Program reimburses up to \$1,000.00 for qualifying expenses, and

WHEREAS, this item has been budgeted in Fiscal Year 2018/19 and is to be funded from General Fund 110 Street Maintenance (110-4140-427006), and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the **CITY COUNCIL** of the **CITY OF OAKDALE** hereby approves a contract with Precision Concrete Cutting for sidewalk grinding and repair in the amount of \$19,515.67 to be funded from Local General Fund 110 Street Maintenance (110-4140-427006).
